I am a long-time member of the ABA and a lifelong Democrat. I have <u>not</u> been particularly enamored of the process engaged in by the ABA in selecting judges to the Federal Judiciary. The ABA has been too political. What the ABA panel did in connection with the Judge Bork and the Judge Thomas selections was atrocious. The sitting U.S. president should have full control over who he nominates, and then the process of advice and consent by the senate should follow. Neither the ABA nor other political groups should give the Senators <u>cover</u>. We are a Democratic Republic under a Constitution, and we do not need private organizations, a minority of two senators or what have you weighing in heavily in connection with a judicial selection. This is not what the founding fathers had in mind nor is it good practice. I think the ABA selection process should be eliminated as it gives an inordinate power to a small number of lawyers who do not have the best interests of the U.S. citizens.





We want to send congratulations on your becoming President of the American Bar Association and to thank you again for your contributions to the June 2007 National Summit on Public Health Legal Preparedness here at CDC.

Our partnership with the ABA, and especially with the Health Law Section, has brought valuable new resources to bear for better public health. The 2007 national summit generated the "National Action Agenda for Public Health Legal Preparedness" that is being implemented nationally.

Just two months ago, a similar, multidisciplinary summit was held in Atlanta to identify legal tools that can be used to help prevent obesity. Health Law Section chair Andrew Demetriou served on the summit's planning committee, took part in the meeting, and is contributing to the forthcoming "National Action Agenda for Legal Preparedness for Obesity Prevention and Control".
