Dear Mr. Wells and Ms. Lamm:

I write as an ABA member and a lawyer of 26 years experience to express my deep consternation and outrage at an article that appeared in today's ABA Journal Weekly Newsletter.

The article, entitled "Lawyer-Run Business Helps Attorneys and Others Arrange Discreet Affairs" describes how a business run by a graduate of York University Law School in Toronto has developed an online agency that helps people who are married or in ostensibly committed relationships "...cheat on a spouse or a romantic partner."

With our country in arguably the worst economic down spiral since the Great Depression, with the historic election of a new president, with reports about the unprecedented politicization of the Bush Justice Department, and with myriad other topics that would be of PROFESSIONAL interest to lawyers, I am incredulous that the ABA Journal publishes such an offensive and

useless article. I wonder rhetorically how much of my annual dues subsidizes the questionable editorial practices of the Journal.

For your information, this situation is quite different than my experience with Public Lawyer Magazine, which has published two of my articles. I have been consistently impressed with that publication's editorial standards and content. The Journal should take a badly needed lesson from one of its brethren.

My concern is with the ABA and the policies and procedures that led the Journal to publish this piece more than with the dubious agency that is the article's subject. After all, I am a dues-paying member of what had once been a more prestigious legal organization than it is today. I find this article to be symptomatic of what ails the ABA in general and is yet another example of questionable ABA decisions and misplaced priorities.

The article's publication also leads me to reconsider my membership. I have discussed this article with many other colleagues who are also ABA members. They are equally outraged.

I look forward to your response. Thank you for your attention.





Dear Hank:

As you know, the Council on Legal Education Opportunity (CLEO) has been in conversation with the General Counsel's staff about CLEO's historic and future relationship with the American Bar Association (ABA). We have had the opportunity to review documents related to the relationship and our Executive Director has had informal exchanges with staff about our current relationship, and the ABA's relationship with other ABA affiliated entities. I have had the opportunity to review and discuss the proposed Agreement with the CLEO Council at our annual meeting on January 3, 2009. Currently, we are exploring the several issues addressed in the Agreement, especially the organizational liability of CLEO's constituent organizations, including the ABA.

The CLEO Council is currently evaluating the ABA's relationship with some of its other affiliated organizations, CLEO's current legal status, and CLEO's strategic plan for the next five years in order to determine what kind of relationship with the ABA would be in the best interest of both CLEO and the ABA in the future. CLEO's Executive Committee will explore and evaluate CLEO's relationship with the ABA and make recommendations with regard to steps that should be taken to strengthen and better define the relationship.

I am confident that once the Executive Committee has had an opportunity to thoroughly examine the current nature of the ABA/CLEO relationship, including liability issues raised in the Draft Agreement, and consulted with the full Council with regard to what kind of relationship places CLEO in the best posture to achieve our diversity goals in the future – we will be in a position to dialogue with you. As soon as we complete our review and evaluation, we will be in a position to engage in the type of discussion required to clarify our relationship with the ABA.
