

Re: Maryland Unreported Decision Jurisprudence

Dear Mr. Wells:

Sometime in the late 1960s, I learned that earlier in that decade, representatives of the ABA's Labor Law Committee sought and got assurances from the Executive Secretary of the National Labor Relations Board that the Board's unpublished representation case decisions would be based on the same rules of decision as were the published decisions. In the 1980s I asked and was told that the Board had adhered to its undertaking. I lost track thereafter. I infer that at some times in the past, the ABA was interested in equal justice under law.

Two years ago, the Supreme Court adopted Rule 32.1 of the Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure, Citing Judicial Dispositions, a step towards equal justice. Unencumbered by knowledge, I assume that representatives of the ABA were involved in the making of 32.1. If so, those representatives may be interested in the enclosed documents. No. 08-1020, and in that event, I would appreciate your passing the documents to them. If there is no institutional interest, and you know of a scholar interested in the subject, I would appreciate your forwarding the documents to that scholar.

The petition demonstrates that in Maryland's unreported decision jurisprudence, the rules of decision of the published and unpublished decisions are, alas, not the same. I venture the hope that one or more of your committees will be interested in promoting the ideal of equal justice under a single body of law.




