On July 10, 2009, colleagues of Judge Susan Harrell Black of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit will gather at a luncheon, sponsored by the Federal Bar Association in Jacksonville, to celebrate her 30 years of service on the federal bench. We would be honored to include from you a letter of appreciation or other acknowledgement of her service as part of our program.

President Jimmy Carter nominated Judge Black to the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Florida in 1979. Confirmed by the Senate on July 23, 1979, she received commission the next day. Judge Black served as chief judge from 1990 to 1992. President George H. W. Bush nominated Judge Black to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit on March 10, 1992. Confirmed by the Senate on August 11, 1992, she received commission the next day and began serving on the court on September 3, 1992.
